Auto Sales - Say What??? What to Buy, and What NOT to Buy... That seems to be the Question! Here are some things to consider when you go out shopping for a new vehicle... Buying New, or Buying Used? Electric vs. Gas? What do we need to know?

Shopping for a new vehicle can be a challenge, especially recently as the Auto Sales industry has been impacted by low inventory and high costs. Trends are changing including one of the newest additions to the industry: Electric Vehicles (EVs). First Trust's Marketing Director, Dorene Martinson, reached out to our long-time community partner, Uptown Limited Auto Sales, to see what guidance they had to offer our members. Martinson stated, "First Trust and Uptown Auto host the Annual Car Sale at our Michigan City branch every year in June. Wynn Wellman, Sales Manager for Uptown Auto, had quite a bit of good advice to offer our car shoppers." Wellman advised to watch out for 'hidden backend fees' - fees that often aren't disclosed until you close on the financing at the end of the buying process. "Ask (a car dealer) upfront about any dealer fees BEFORE you begin car shopping," Wellman said. "Also, nothing can compare to inspecting the vehicle in person! CARFAX reports (and similar history inspecting tools) can be altered, or incidents can go unreported, so you MUST physically inspect!"

Another avenue to consider is buying an electric vehicle verses the standard gas vehicle. With gas prices soaring, buying 'electric' seems to make sense .... or does it? Wellman advised that electric vehicles (EVs) may be a good alternative for work commutes or shorter distance trips, and possible have less maintenance costs during the earlier years of the vehicle's life. He also added, "The batteries used to power current EVs are extremely expensive... and you never know when a battery might fail." Wellman also pointed out that each electric vehicle manufacturer requires their own charging system, opposed to a standard system all EVs could utilize. He says that as this new technology advances, that could change, but for now there are many variables that are still unknown in the world of EVs. The bottom line here seems to be to do your research and ask the important questions when purchasing a new vehicle. Wellman wraps

up by saying that good customer service from your car dealer is MOST important, and that continues AFTER the sale as well. Read customer reviews and choose dealers that will go above and beyond for their customers. First Trust offers Auto Loans
